### James “Jim” Arnold

James “Jim” Arnold currently serves as Chief of the Policy and Liaison Section, Diversion Control Division, Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) at DEA Headquarters in Washington, DC. Jim has also served as the Chief of the Policy Unit and the Chief of the Regulatory Unit at DEA Headquarters, as well as in various other investigative and supervisory positions at the DEA New Jersey Field Division, Newark, New Jersey. His efforts in the New Jersey Field Division focused on administrative, civil, and criminal investigations of DEA registrants and other individuals and organizations who were engaged in violations of the Controlled Substances Act and/or with other illegal activities with legitimate, and illegal, controlled substances and listed chemicals.

With over 29 years of experience with the DEA Jim has spoken nationwide on numerous regulatory subjects; has coordinated and spearheaded investigations on various regulatory issues of nationwide importance for DEA and the Department of Justice; was intimately involved with various investigations and prosecutions of DEA registrants at the height of the opioid prescription drug problem in south Florida in 2011 and 2012; and has been an Instructor at the DEA Justice Training Center in Quantico, Virginia, for Intelligence Research Specialists, Special Agents of Tactical Diversion Squads, and new Basic Diversion Investigator Classes since July of 1999.

Jim is a proud graduate of West Chester State University, and Drew University, where he received a Master’s Degree. Jim has been the recipient of numerous awards and commendations throughout his DEA career in recognition of many successful investigations and prosecutions, and for his leadership, performance and commitment to public service.

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### Anthony Campbell, RPH, D.O. FACP

Dr. Anthony Campbell is currently a board certified internist and clinical pharmacologist who currently services as a Clinical Specialty Consultant with the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, Center for Substance Abuse Treatment in the Division of Pharmacologic Therapies (SAMHSA/CSAT/DPT). He and serves as a Commander in the United States Public Health Service. In his role at SAMHSA, he is responsible for planning, directing and evaluating the development of pharmacotherapy-based treatment standards and guidelines that require specialized DPT medical review. In addition he is an adjunct professor at both Howard University Colleges of Pharmacy and Medicine in Washington DC. Dr. Campbell earned two bachelor’s degrees from Howard University; Chemistry (85) and Pharmacy (88). He earned his Doctorate of Osteopathic Medicine from Ohio University (94). His post-graduate training also includes a residency in Internal Medicine with specific training in Clinical Pharmacology. 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### Dan Cohen

Dan Cohen is the Executive Vice President, Government and Public Relations with **KemPharm, Inc.**, a biopharmaceutical “Prodrug” company which develops and commercializes technology to create a diverse pipeline of therapeutics that target market opportunities in pain, attention deficit hyperactivity disorder and other central nervous system indications. He also serves as the Forum Chair of the **US Abuse Deterrent Coalition**, a “talk group” of over 30

Abuse Deterrence Formulations (ADF) “innovator” manufacturers, patient advocates and related organizations seeking to expand access to ADF technologies.

He is the Vice Chairman of the Board of Directors for the **MedStar National Rehabilitation Hospital Network**, a 129 bed, \$120m annual revenue specialty hospital and is a member of the Quality, Safety and Patient Affairs subcommittee of the **MedStar Hospital Network** Board of Directors. He is a member of the Board of Trustees of the **Keystone Policy Center**, where his focus is healthcare public policy.

Previously, as the Senior Vice President for Government Relations and Health Policy with **EnteroMedics**, an early-stage medical device company, he was part of the senior management team that led the successful 2015 FDA approval of the first new obesity medical device for consumers since 2001.

As the Consulting Head of North American Government Relations, he was responsible for public policy and governmental regulatory relations in Washington, D.C. and Canada for **Grünenthal USA**, a biopharmaceutical company which develops and commercializes ADF for opioid analgesics.

Formerly, as Managing Director/Global Government Relations for **The Depository Trust & Clearing Corporation**, he was responsible for leading government relation functions, including formulating the overall strategy, representing the DTCC before the U.S. Congress, European Parliament, Asian governments and their respective regulatory bodies.

Cohen has served in Washington, D.C. since 1979 and has experience in various senior-level government relations positions. Prior to his current roles, Cohen served as a senior executive with several medical device and healthcare corporations, including **US Oncology/McKesson**, the largest U.S. national oncology physician provider network, and **Inamed/Allergan**, a medical device/aesthetics company. In those positions, he established Washington, D.C. and global government relations functions, led the companies’ legislative policy and governmental regulatory relations program and was also responsible for managing public policy, investor relations, and political functions at the state, national and global levels.

Cohen was a principal at **Loeffler, Jonas & Tuggey, LLP**, where he managed several clients in healthcare including **Purdue Pharma** and **Inamed**, as well as the financial services industry including **Citibank** and the **Economic and Trade Office of Hong Kong**. Earlier in his career, Cohen was the senior legislative liaison for the **American Israel Public Affairs Committee (AIPAC)**, an Alternate Delegate of the United States to the **United Nations**, US Chairman of an international NGO and earlier served as Legislative Director for two Congressmen on Capitol Hill and in various campaign positions at the Presidential, Congressional, State and local levels.

Additional Boards of Directors or Committees include recent tenures with the U.S. Congress chartered “**Congressional Award Foundation**,” the **Business-Government Relations Council**, the **Ocean Reef Club** and as Chair of the **College of William & Mary Parent & Family Council**.

Cohen earned a bachelor’s degree in Sociology from **Willamette University** and awarded a Master of Arts/Liberal Studies degree in International Affairs from **Georgetown University**.

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## **Richard C. Dart, MD, PhD**

Richard C. Dart, MD, PhD, is the Director of the Rocky Mountain Poison & Drug Center, Denver Health and Hospital Authority. He is the Executive Director of Researched Abuse, Diversion, and Addiction- Related Surveillance (RADARS®) System. He is also Professor of Emergency Medicine at the University of Colorado School of Medicine. He is past-president of the American Association of Poison Control Centers (AAPCC) and is Fellow of the American College of Medical Toxicology (FACMT), American Academy of Clinical Toxicology (FAACT) and American College of Emergency Physicians (FACEP).

Raised in Michigan, Dr. Dart earned his bachelor’s degree in biology at Albion College and his medical degree at Wayne State University in Detroit, Michigan. He completed residency training in emergency medicine at the University of Arizona and then completed a fellowship in Medical Toxicology as well as a doctorate of Pharmacology and Toxicology at the University of Arizona. He is board certified by the American Board of Medical Toxicology.

Dr. Dart has earned numerous awards for his teaching, research and leadership endeavors. He was the 2004 recipient of the American College of Medical Toxicology Matthew J. Ellenhorn Award for Excellence in Medical Toxicology. He was selected as an inaugural member of the Medical Toxicology Subboard of the American Board of Emergency Medicine. In 2002 he was recognized with a special citation from the Commissioner of the U.S. Food and Drug Administration for his work on snake antivenom. He is the 2017 recipient of the AACT Career Achievement Award. His research interests include the postmarketing surveillance of opioid analgesics, development of orphan antidotes (antivenoms, metal chelators and others), the stocking of antidotes, various aspects of OTC analgesic toxicity and their treatments, and adverse drug event reporting.

In 2000, Dr. Dart edited the first edition of *The 5-Minute Toxicology Consult* and is the editor *Medical Toxicology 3rd edition*, a well-known text for toxicologists. He has published more than 250 scientific publications and is frequently invited to lecture to health care and regulatory audiences. He is also a Deputy Editor of medical journal *Annals of Emergency Medicine*.

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### **Michael Goff**

**Michael Goff** is currently the Acting Executive Director and Administrator of the Controlled Substances Monitoring Program for the West Virginia Board of Pharmacy, and has served in that capacity since 2012. He received his B.S. degree from West Virginia University in 1986, with a major in Chemistry. He began his career with the West Virginia State Police in 1987, where he worked for 13 years as a Forensic Chemist, as well as Laboratory QA Officer. His next 12 years he worked in the Special Operations Division as the Logistics Officer, and was also responsible for the State Police Clandestine Lab Training and Response Program. His duties there also included expert witness testimony in chemistry matters, assisting with developing Department policy and working with the State legislature regarding statutes, rules and regulations related to clandestine labs and various controlled substance issues. He retired from the West Virginia State Police as a Lieutenant in 2012, after 25 years of service, before accepting his current position.

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### **Thomas Gorman**

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Thomas Gorman is a graduate San Jose State University and joined the California Bureau of Narcotic Enforcement. He served ten years as an undercover agent. He made 1,000 undercover purchases and received two Purple Hearts from being shot and later stabbed. He was promoted in 1990 to deputy chief in charge of statewide drug enforcement operations. In 1997 he retired to become the director of the Rocky Mountain HIDTA. Director Gorman is a graduate of the FBI National Academy and is past president of the California Narcotic Officers Association and the National Alliance of State Drug Enforcement Agencies. He is currently president of the National HIDTA Directors Association. He authored *The Myths of Drug Legalization* and *Marijuana Legalization: The Issues*. He authored a recently published book titled *To Believe or not Believe, That is the Question - An Undercover Agent's Quest for the Truth*.

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### **Sherry Green**

Sherry L. Green has 23 years of expertise in writing, analyzing, and training on drug and alcohol laws and policies, specializing in state prescription drug monitoring program (PMP) laws. Ms. Green served as Associate Director of the President's Commission on Model State Drug Laws and co-drafted the Commission's 44 model laws and policies. She co-founded and for 20 years served as CEO/Executive Director of the Commission's non-profit successor, the National Alliance for Model State Drug Laws (NAMSDL). From July 2016 – June 2017, Ms. Green served as President, and developed a new strategic action plan for NAMSDL. The plan will enhance the organization's ability to provide more in-depth services to government officials, and health care and criminal justice professionals. Ms. Green returned to NAMSDL as CEO in July 2017. Throughout her 23 career, Ms. Green has also served as an independent consultant to state, national, federal, and international organizations and officials.

Ms. Green served as the PMP subject matter expert for a U.S. HHS project on integration of PMP data into electronic health record systems. She was the drafter for NASCSA's Model PMP Act and is a primary drafter of NAMSDL's model laws and policies. She currently serves as a PMP subject matter expert for the Association of State and Territorial Health

Officials (ASTHO) and CDC. Ms. Green trains and educates extensively on PMPs, HIPAA (Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act), and other key laws and policies for diverse bodies, including the National Conference of State Legislatures and the International Pharmaceutical Student Federation.

Ms. Green has a Juris Doctor with Honors from George Washington University's National Law Center in Washington, D.C. and is a member of the D.C. Bar. She received a Bachelor's of Arts degree in Political Science-Economics from the University of Montana.

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### **Eric Griffin**

**Eric Griffin** is the Director of Compliance & Enforcement for the State of Ohio Board of Pharmacy. He oversees the daily operations of the Compliance & Enforcement Division, managing a staff of more than thirty investigators and support staff. He routinely directs major investigations, facilitates public outreach and training, and coordinates multi-agency initiatives. Eric started his law enforcement career at Delaware County Sheriff's Office where he served in numerous positions including Detective, Sergeant, Drug Task Commander, and Lieutenant. Eric has led and participated in a multitude of investigations at the State and Federal Level in the prosecution of Homicides and Major Drug Offenders to Health Care Professionals. As a Lieutenant, he supervised and oversaw the daily operations of the Detective Bureau, Drug Task Force and Administrative Investigations. Eric has more than twenty years of law enforcement experience and has attended countless training sessions across the country. Eric regularly presents on issues concerning drugs of abuse and diversion to law enforcement, administrative agencies, and the general public.

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### **Sean Hanna**

**Sean Hanna**, LAC, MAOM, is the Senior Director of Veteran Engagement at the Meadows Mental Health Policy Institute. Sean spent eight and a half years, from 1991 to 2000, as a US Navy Hospital Corpsman. While stationed at 1st Light Armored Reconnaissance Battalion, 1st Marine Division, Sean deployed to multiple international locations and saw combat action in support of Operation United Shield, Somalia in 1995. Since his military duty, Sean served as Director of the Veterans Mental Health Program (VMHP) at the Texas Veterans Commission. There he worked with the Texas Department of State Health Services to co-create and coordinate the Military Veteran Peer Network throughout the State of Texas as part of the VMHP. Sean earned his Master of Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine degree from the Academy of Oriental Medicine at Austin (AOMA) in 2005, and is a lifetime member of Veterans of Foreign Wars Post #4443.

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### **Selin Hoboy**

**Selin Hoboy**, Vice President of Legislative and Regulatory Affairs for Stericycle, Inc, is responsible for managing legislative and regulatory affairs and has been with working with Stericycle operations since 2000. Selin monitors Federal EPA, DOT, OSHA and DEA, and other regulatory issues and closely monitors legislation at the Local, State and Federal levels. **Tom Knight** is the Founder and CEO of Invistics, a provider of software solutions that help prevent drug diversion and improve controlled substances inventory management in hospitals, healthcare facilities, pharmaceutical manufacturers, laboratories, R&D centers, and other areas of the pharmaceutical supply chain. Prior to founding Invistics 18 years ago, Tom spent 10 years improving inventory management at Alcoa and Siemens, and holds three degrees from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT).

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## **Andrew Kolodny**

**Andrew Kolodny, MD** is one of the nation's leading experts on the prescription opioid and heroin crisis devastating families and communities across the country. He is Co-Director of the Opioid Policy Research Collaborative at the Heller School for Social Policy and Management at Brandeis University. He is also the executive director of Physicians for Responsible Opioid Prescribing, an organization with a mission to reduce morbidity and mortality caused by overprescribing of opioid analgesics.

Dr. Kolodny previously served as Chief Medical Officer for Phoenix House, a national non profit addiction treatment agency and as Chair of Psychiatry at Maimonides Medical Center in New York City. Dr. Kolodny has a long-standing interest in public health. He began his career working for the New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene in the Office of the Executive Deputy Commissioner. For New York City, he helped develop and implement multiple programs to improve the health of New Yorkers and save lives, including city-wide buprenorphine programs, naloxone overdose prevention programs and emergency room-based screening, brief intervention and referral to treatment (SBIRT) programs for drug and alcohol misuse.

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## **Alan McGill**

**Alan McGill** is a Supervisory Narcotics Agent with the Pennsylvania Office of Attorney General, Bureau of Narcotics Investigation and Drug Control. Agent McGill is currently assigned as both a street supervisor and diversion unit supervisor. Agent McGill has spent 29 years as an investigator with 21 of those years in law enforcement. Although Agent McGill has worked as an undercover narcotics agent, drug task force coordinator and conducted complex narcotics trafficking investigations, he is considered one of the Attorney General's experts in the area of Prescription Drug Diversion having personally conducted and/or supervised hundreds of prescription drug investigations. Agent McGill conducts approximately 20 to 30 presentations a year on prescription drug investigations for law enforcement as well as hospitals, universities and medical associations throughout Pennsylvania.

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## **Jake Nichols**

**Jake Nichols** is a pharmacist and individual in long-term recovery who specializes in addiction medicine, specifically in medication assisted treatment for opioid use disorder. Through his fifteen-year struggle with substance abuse, he found his calling in the field and has dedicated his career to helping patients and their families who suffer from this debilitating chronic disease. By providing clinical support for clinicians treating patients with substance use disorder and serving as a vocal advocate for treatment, Jake has established himself as a key resource within the field. Dr. Nichols has spoken at well over 50 pharmacy, nursing, and medical schools across the country in the past 3 years, sharing his story with students and faculty, and he regularly facilitates patient and parent support groups. More recently, he and a colleague established a treatment, clinical research organization, and non-profit foundation called the Recovery Research Network. As company President and Chief Operating Officer, he oversees all clinical activity and operations. Jake received his Doctor of Pharmacy Degree from the Massachusetts College of Pharmacy in 2000 and his Master's Degree in Business Administration from UMass Boston in 2007. Jake has worked within community pharmacy, academia, primary care, managed care, and pharmaceutical industry.

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## **Julio Pena**

**Julio Pena** Assistant Chief Patrol Agent is assigned to the DHS Joint Taskforce West (JTF-W) in San Antonio, Texas as the Deputy Chief of the Intelligence Section (J2). As such, he leads a diverse team of analysis and enforcement personnel from the CBP Office of Intelligence, U.S. Border Patrol, ICE HSI and ERO, U.S. Coast Guard, Citizenship and Immigration Services, and other interagency and intelligence community personnel to integrate and align DHS intelligence capabilities in support of the JTF-W mission.

ACPA Pena entered on duty with the U.S. Border Patrol in August of 2000 at the Laredo North Station. He was a law instructor at the USBP Academy in Charleston, SC in 2003 and a firearms instructor at the USBP Academy in Artesia, NM in 2005. He promoted to Supervisory Border Patrol Agent (SBPA) at the Laredo South Station in January 2006 and subsequently served as an SBPA at the Laredo Sector Intelligence Unit and the Laredo Sector Training Office. He transferred to the Detroit Sector Intelligence Unit in December 2007 and was the Acting Patrol Agent in Charge (PAIC) of the Detroit Sector Intelligence Unit until his selection as an Assistant Chief at CBP HQ in March 2009.

At CBP HQ his duties were focused on mission integration, special operations, incident management, and intelligence. They included deployment to Tegucigalpa (Honduras), Hawaii, Iowa, and other locations to oversee special operations and help manage critical incidents. In March 2012 he transferred to the Lordsburg Station as a Special Operations Supervisor and was subsequently promoted to Deputy PAIC of the Alamogordo Station and PAIC of the Sault Sainte Marie Station in Michigan. He began his current assignment at Joint Task Force West in July 2015.

ACPA Pena was recognized with the 2009 CBP Commissioner Mission Integration Award for his work leading an interagency team to counter illicit tunneling activity. He also received the 2013 Excellence in Public Service Award from the Federal Executive Association in West Texas and Southern New Mexico for his work increasing the efficiency of CBP non-intrusive inspection equipment.

ACPA Pena completed a Master's Degree in Homeland Security from the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College in Ft. Leavenworth, KS in June 2015. He also completed the Homeland Security Strategic Planning Course at the National Defense University/Joint Forces Staff College in 2012 and graduated from the George Washington University Senior Leader's Program in 2011. He has a double Bachelor of Arts Degree (Psychology and Spanish) from the University of Texas Pan American (2000) and is currently pursuing a second Master's Degree in International Relations from Webster University.

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### **Larry Pinson**

**Larry Pinson** is a graduate of the University of California at San Francisco School of Pharmacy in 1973, practiced pharmacy for 32 years prior to being selected for the position of Executive Secretary of the Nevada State Board of Pharmacy. He owned and operated his own pharmacy, Silverada Pharmacy, in Reno for 22 years after practicing hospital pharmacy at St. Mary's Hospital in Reno for 5 years. Larry was appointed and reappointed by two Governors to serve the maximum of 9 years on the Nevada State Board of Pharmacy, presiding over the Board for more than 8 of those years, as well as being appointed by Governor Guinn for two terms on the Nevada State Pharmacy and Therapeutics Committee. He has held an adjunct professorship with Idaho State University since 1989, and serves as a preceptor for pharmacy students for North Dakota State University, Roseman University, Chicago State University and Creighton University. Besides serving as a consulting pharmacist for numerous facilities and organizations over the years, he is a past member of the Board of Governors and Past President of the Alumni Association for UCSF. He also sits on the Executive Committee for the National Association of Controlled Substances Authorities (NASCSA). Dr. Pinson received the Bowl of Hygieia for the state of Nevada in 1984 and was selected "Pharmacist of the Year" by the state pharmacist's association in 1999.

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### **Mary-Lou Schoonover**

**Mary-Lou Schoonover** has more than 18 years in Pharmaceutical Compliance. She began her career in 1999 as Data Analyst with MedPro Systems. She was promoted to Sr. Data Analyst and then to the head of Quality Assurance where she managed a team of 6 individuals. She was responsible for ensuring MedPro's compliance with the Pharmaceutical Drug Marketing Act as it pertained to the prescription drug sampling of medical practitioners as well as to compliance with the Sunshine Act, for Federal Aggregate Spend reporting.

After 13 years with MedPro, Mary-Lou left to join the DEA Compliance Team at Actavis. She was responsible for all the controlled substance import and export activities for the company as well as to the overseeing of the companies more than 700 licenses and registrations. Mary-Lou became a key contributor to the companies relicensing efforts during Actavis' period of mergers and acquisitions.

Since leaving Actavis, Mary-Lou has furthered in career in DEA and Regulatory Compliance first with Reckitt Benckiser and most currently with the United States Pharmacopeia. Paralegal Studies and is a Certified Corporate Paralegal. In her spare time, she volunteers her time with non-profit organizations in NJ that promote drug awareness and education.

**Joshua S. Vinciguerra** is the Director of the Bureau of Narcotic Enforcement at the New York State Department of Health. He is a former federal prosecutor in the U.S. Attorney's Office for the Northern District of New York. He has also served as an Assistant Attorney General in the New York State Attorney General's Criminal Enforcement and Financial Crimes Bureau, and as an Assistant District Attorney in the New York County District Attorney's Office under Mr. Robert Morgenthau, where he prosecuted narcotics and weapons crimes in the Office of Special Narcotics, and white-collar crime in the Frauds Bureau. He clerked in the New York State Supreme Court, Appellate Division, Fourth Department, in Rochester, New York. He is a volunteer firefighter.
