# President's Commission on Combating Addiction and the Opioid Crisis

- Increased utilization
  - ✓ Comprehensive interjurisdictional sharing
    - States; St. Louis County, MO; D.C.
    - Federal health care systems
    - July 1, 2018 deadline
  - ✓ Ease of use
  - ✓ Inclusion of other data



# Opioid Crisis – National Emergency?

- Unclear status of declaration
- Uncertain impact of emergency declaration



# Prescription Drug Monitoring Act of 2017

- Eligibility for Harold Rogers PDMP and NASPER federal grants
  - ✓ Mandated Use
    - Prescribers – prior to initiating treatment with Schedule II-IV prescription
    - Every 3 months thereafter
  - ✓ Proactive notification to practitioner



# Prescription Drug Monitoring Act of 2017

- ✓ Reporting to PDMP/PMP no later than 24 hours after dispensing
  - ✓ De-identified data set available quarterly and distribute annual report
  - ✓ Data available to other states
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- Data-sharing single technology solution



# Prescription Drug Monitoring Act of 2017

- ✓ State owns data
- ✓ Source of de-identified data
- ✓ No user fee for access by authorized users
- ✓ Conform with PMIX standards
- ✓ No distribution of data without written consent of PMP Authority
- ✓ No limitation on distribution of data as approved by PMP Authority



# Federal Grants

- CDC Prevention for States (PfS)
  - ✓ 29 states
  - ✓ Through 2019 - annual awards between \$750,000 and \$1 million
  - ✓ Maximizing PMPs
    - Universal registration and use
    - Easier to use and access





# Federal Grants

- Expanding/improving proactive reporting
- Using data to better understand nature of overdose epidemic
  
- BJA Harold Rogers Prescription Drug Monitoring Program
  - ✓ 11 states
  - ✓ 24 month awards - \$178,580 – \$400,000



# Federal Grants

- ✓ Implementation, enhancement, and proactive use for clinical decision-making and prevention of misuse and diversion
  - Facilitate exchange of information and data
  - Training program
  - Production/dissemination of educational materials
  - Collaborations with criminal justice and health care professionals



# Federal Grants

- Improve quality and accuracy of data
- Develop/enhance capacity to send unsolicited reports

# State Law Trends in PMP Optimization

## **Statutes and rules that support real time, active, and innovative operations:**

- Next-Day Data Reporting from Dispensers
- Mandated Use Requirement
- Enables the disclosure of de-identified data for public health research
- Includes non-traditional PMP data, such as non-fatal overdoses and drug-related convictions
- Supports active management of PMP data to make appropriate referrals
- Proactive alerting and unsolicited reporting to all constituencies

## **Statutes and rules that support the existing national network of PMPs:**

- Recognizes the value in sharing data with users in other states
- Supports regional efforts to coordinate PMP operations



# State Law Trends in PMP Optimization

**Statutes and rules that support healthcare workflow integration at the point of care:**

- Allows Health Information Technology (EHR and Pharmacy Software) integration
- Recognizes the value of team-based health care by allowing access by other healthcare professionals
- Empowers prescribers to complete self-assessment and self-improvement activities for their own practice
- Encourages prescriber accountability via medical director access

# Technology Trends in PMP Optimization

PMP Technology that supports the user experience for all constituencies:

- Completely online user experience:
  - Registration
  - Data Request
  - Data Retrieval
- Data visualizations and data analytics available
- Utilization of web services to verify external credential data (state license/DEA/NPI)
- Administrator functionalities that facilitate the use and monitoring of data
