Illinois Compassionate Use of Medical Cannabis Pilot Program Act

In August 2013, Illinois became the 20th state to authorize a program for the cultivation and dispensing of cannabis for medical purposes

Illinois Compassionate Use of Medical Cannabis
Pilot Program Act (effective 1/1/2014)- Initial pilot
program to provide access to medical cannabis for
qualifying patients

Currently 37 states; plus Washington DC, Puerto Rico, Guam, and US Virgin Islands have enacted medical cannabis legislation

History of Cannabis Legislation in Illinois

PA 098-0122 Enacted 1/1/2014

 Authorized Medical Cannabis Pilot Program; sunset 6/30/2018

PA 099-519 Enacted 6/30/2016

- Extended the pilot program through June 30, 2020
- Added PTSD to the definition of "debilitating condition" and added a terminal illness eligibility category

PA 100-1114 Enacted 8/28/2018

- Established the OAPP
- Provisional access to dispensaries for medical cannabis patient applicants
- Removed fingerprinting requirements and eliminated disqualifying criminal offenses

PA 099-0775 Enacted 7/21/2014

- Added seizure disorders to the definition of "debilitating condition"
- Allows persons under age 18 to apply for a medical cannabis registration card

PA 100-0660 Enacted 8/1/2018

 Ashley's Law – Allows caregivers of minor registered patients to administer medical cannabis on school property

PA 101-0027 Enacted 1/1/2020

- Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act
- Legalization of recreational Cannabis
- Possession of up to 30 grams immediately legal

Opioid Alternative Pilot Program (OAPP)

Program Strategies

- Develop and implement systems and processes to enroll qualified Illinois adults into the OAPP
- Educate stakeholder groups (physicians, dispensaries, qualifying patients, local health departments, law enforcement) about OAPP
- Ensure quality and satisfaction of OAPP

Short-term Outcomes

- Increase in number of physicians who report an increase in knowledge and awareness about OAPP
- Increase in number of physicians who submit an OAPP PC for a qualifying patient

Intermediate Outcomes

- Increased knowledge and awareness about OAPP across all stakeholder groups
- Increased number of physicians who report awareness about OAPP and encourage qualifying patients to enroll in OAPP

Long-term Outcomes

• Decreased overdoses related to opioid prescription drugs

Opioid Alternative Pilot Program

General Provisions

Qualifying patients

- Patient has a current prescription for an opioid, OR patient could be prescribed an opioid based on generally accepted standards of care
- Must be 21 or older at the time of registration
- No caregiver provisions for OAPP
- Cannot have a Commercial Driver's License or School Bus Permit

OAPP Physician Certification is valid for 90-day registration period

Patient limited to 2.5 ounces of medical cannabis every 14-days.

No dual registration in OAPP and MCPP

After 90-day registration period, qualifying patients can register again

Patients with a qualifying debilitating condition may apply for MCPP

- Prescriber education about OAPP

"For the purposes of patient care, the Prescription Monitoring Program shall make a notation on the person's prescription record stating that the person has a written certification under the Opioid Alternative Pilot Program and is a patient who is entitled to the lawful medical use of cannabis."

About Us

The Illinois Prescription Monitoring Program (ILPMP) is an electronic database that collects, tracks, and stores reported dispensing data on controlled substances in schedules II-V and selected drugs of interest, as well as other types of health information.

Healthcare providers can view 12 months of a patient's prescription history to assist with clinical decisions regarding prescribing and dispensing. Prescribers can also view a history of prescriptions dispensed under their DEA number.

Dispensers, prescribers and their designees can register for an account at ILPMP.org. The data in the ILPMP database is reported by pharmacies and other state departments. The ILPMP does not guarantee the complete accuracy of a patient's prescription history or other healthcare information as it is dependent on the information provided. If you notice an error in reporting, please contact us.

The ILPMP is overseen by the Illinois Department of Human Services and was authorized by the Illinois Controlled Substances Act (720 ILCS 570/316) and strictly adheres to HIPAA and all access, disclosure and confidentiality provisions of Illinois Law.


